What is this application form for?

Use this form to make application for Surrender (cancellation) of a licence to Take and Use water and/or to Operate Works.

This application combines the requirements for the surrender under S61 Water Act 1989 of:

- A Licence to Take and Use Water (Section 51 Water Act 1989)
- A Licence to Operate Works (Section 67 Water Act 1989).
- A Licence to Decommission Works (Section 67 Water Act 1989)

- Complete the form in full ensuring all relevant information is provided.
- Complete the checklist. Incorrect information may result in your application being refused. **Your application will be returned if it is Ineligible or incomplete.**

CRITERIA OF A BORE THAT REQUIRES DECOMMISSION

Replacement application- Bores being replaced due to poor bore yield.	Potentially	Poor bore yield due to low water table .(Retained for D&S)
Replacement application- Bore being replaced due to casing/bore failure.	Yes	WL application(Decommission)
Bore no longer required – Owner identifies that the bore is no longer required or wanted.	Yes	WL application(Decommission)
Bore is no longer suitable for clients’ needs. Low Flows, Irrigation, Salinity to great.	Yes	WL application(Decommission)
The casing has deteriorated, leading to poor casing integrity. Examples are severely corroded casing, or brittle PVC.	Yes	WL application(Decommission)
Bore is blocked /collapsed- Pump can’t be removed, full of sand, open hole collapse.	Yes.	WL application(Decommission)

General information and explanatory notes

Why do I have to apply to surrender or cancel my Licence?

If you no longer have a requirement to take and use water from a bore, waterway or dam under an existing licence you must make application to surrender the licence. This is because you will continue to be liable for payment of annual fixed charges for the licence until an application to surrender the licence is lodged with GMW. There is no application fee for the surrender of a licence but all outstanding charges must be paid prior to the application being approved.

Can I surrender my Works Licence (S67) only and retain a Take and use Licence (S51) (surface water)

Yes, you can surrender your works licence upon the following:

- A) if there are no works in place
- B) if you are no longer using the water but works are retained. Before you install or extract water you must make application to the Authority.

Will Annual Fees still apply if I surrender my Works Licence Only (S67)

Yes, you will be subject to annual fees, service fee, access fee and resource management fee. A service point fee will NOT apply.

Can I only surrender my Take and Use Licence (S51) and only retain a Works Licence (S67) (surface water)

Yes, you can surrender but you will be subject to service and service point fees. Should you wish to reinstate this licence in the future an application to the Authority will be required.

Do I need to decommission the works? (Surfacewater)

Yes, if you are surrendering a Works Licence (Section 67) the pump and diversion works must be removed from the waterway and any damage to the bed and banks of the waterway must be reinstated.

All works (including pipelines and channels) used in relation to this licence have been removed from the frontage reserve or any Crown Land and the area concerned returned to a condition compatible with the surrounding frontage land. (Please note: This condition applies to all situation where occupation of Crown Land is authorised on the licence)

Do I require consent if the works are not located on my land?

Yes, consent is required from the relevant Authority's if any of the following applies:

- On freehold land now owned by the applicant, consent of the land owner identifying where the works and associated works are sited
- On an easement, evidence that the applicant has notified the easement owner
- On Crown Land, consent of the Minister administering the *Conversation, Forest and Land Act 1987*
- On a Waterway within a Park referred to in section 30M of the National Parks Act 1975, consent of Minister administering the *National Parks Act 1975*

What happens after I lodge my application to surrender a Works Licence(S67) (surfacewater)?

After you lodge your application GMW will issue a Works Licence (S67) to decommission the work/s. The licence is valid for 6 months. Upon completion of the works you should forward the "Notice of Outcome" provided with your licence document to GMW. Once received by GMW we will then surrender your licence. Any changes to your annual account will be completed at this time. to your annual account will be completed at this time

Do I need to decommission the works? (Groundwater)

You can retain works for domestic and stock purposes once the licence has been surrendered.

Why do I need to decommission a bore?

Generally a bore will need to be removed or decommissioned if it is no longer in use or is beyond repair. If a bore is not decommissioned correctly it may pose a risk to public health and to the long term quality of groundwater resources.

How do I know if my bore needs to be decommissioned?

If you own a bore that is not part of a regular maintenance schedule, it may need to be decommissioned. Particularly if it is (refer to Criteria for decommissioning a bore) :

- More than 20 years old and not in current use
- Constructed from steel casing
- Damaged or corroded
- Pumping sand
- Yielding saltier/poorer quality water than it has in the past
- Flowing uncontrollably
- Dewatering quickly
- Silted, collapsed or blocked
- No longer needed, or has been replaced by a new bore

Why do I need a licence to decommission a bore?

Under the provisions of the Water Act 1989, any work conducted on a bore, including the decommissioning of a bore must not be carried out until a Licence to Decommission Works has been issued. Licensing this activity ensures that works are carried out correctly and will not pose any ongoing risks to the public safety or the environment. It also ensures that accurate records are kept in relation to the status of bores across GMW's region.

Who can decommission a bore?

In most cases where the bore is shallow and has intersected only a single aquifer system, it is acceptable for the bore owner to carry out the work. The decommissioning of bores that are deep, flowing or have intersected more than one aquifer system, can be more complex and it is a requirement that the work be undertaken by a suitably licensed driller.
