



NOTICE TO BOAT OPERATORS AND GENERAL PUBLIC



FIRES AND CAMPING AROUND LAKE EILDON

Fires and camping are only permitted in designated camping areas around Lake Eildon (see below).

Why?

Unregulated campfires are a potential hazard for bushfires. They also create a problem with accumulation of rubbish and pollution to the domestic water supply.

To minimise these impacts, Parks Victoria provides defined areas where camping and fires are permitted.

Boat-Based Camping Areas

Three Boat-Based Camping Areas are located around the shores of Lake Eildon within Lake Eildon National Park. They are only accessible by boat or foot and provide a more remote camping experience (see map).

- · Mountaineer Inlet (top of Aird Inlet)
- · Taylors Creek (Big River Arm)
- · Coopers Point (Main Arm)

Composting toilets are provided at each site. Fires are permitted only at Mountaineer inlet and Taylors Creek.

Other Camping Areas

- Jerusalem Creek Camping Area Boat access is from the Jerusalem Creek Inlet.
 Designated camping sites with basic toilets and fireplaces are provided. Camping fees apply and permits are available at either end of the camping area. Bookings are available through the Parks Victoria web site: www.parkstay.vic.gov.au or Phone 13 1963
- Fraser Camping Area Coller Bay has formal camping facilities with toilets and hot showers.
 Fires are only permitted in fireplaces provided.
 Bookings are available through the Parks Victoria web site: www.parkstay.vic.gov.au or Phone 13 1963
- Delatite Arm Reserve Designated camping sites are provided, some with basic toilets.
 No camping is permitted below the high water mark,

Fire

Within the specified camping areas, fires must be contained within fireplaces provided. Please keep fires to a minimum size and gather only fallen, dead timber. Removal of any timber from below the Full Supply Level of the lake is Prohibited.

On declared days of Total Fire Ban, ALL SOLID FUEL CAMPFIRES, PORTABLE GAS APPLIANCES AND KEROSENE LANTERNS ARE PROHIBITED. This includes all gas stoves, gas lights and gas fridges (Including use Inside tents). IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO FIND OUT INFORMATION ON TOTAL FIRE BAN DAYS via radio broadcasts or by contacting the Bushfire Information Line on 1800 240 667,

Dogs

Dogs are not permitted in Lake Eildon National Park so please be aware of your mooring location if you are taking a dog on board a boat.

Dogs are only permitted in the Jerusalem Creek Camping Area and Delatite Arm Reserve and dogs must be on a lead at all times.

Motorbikes and Motor Vehicles

Motorbikes and vehicles are only permitted on formed roadways open to the public (<u>this</u> excludes the shores of the lake and the lakebed).

All vehicles must be roadworthy, registered and riders/drivers must be fully licenced.

 Penalties apply to vehicles operating on the lakebed in any area other than designated launching areas. Inappropriate use of vehicles may lead to prosecution.
