It operates on a cost recovery basis and provides for the ongoing<br>refurbishment of infrastructure of the system. At Lake Mulwala G-MW maintains and manages the Weir structure, on behalf of the Murray-Darling<br>Basin Authority. Water releases and lake level are managed by the Authorities River Murray division. G-MW manages Victorian public lake bed and<br>public foreshore land, and delivers various projects and programs subject to direction and funding by the MDBA. G-MW coordinates the blue green<br>algal monitoring and response program, and is responsible for licencing and approving structures on the Victorian foreshore. G-MW is also primarily<br>responsible for the implementation of the Lake Mulwala Land and On-Water Management Plan on behalf of the MDBA. |  |
