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Mid Goulburn Groundwater Management Area

The Mid Goulburn Groundwater Management Area (GMA) extends from the foothills of the Great Dividing Range near Avenel to Wunghnu in the north and incorporates the towns of Nagambie, Tatura and Shepparton – *refer to map overleaf*.

Groundwater resources in the GMA are managed under a Local Management Plan, which was approved by Goulburn-Murray Water (GMW) in 2014 (the Plan).

Groundwater resources

Rainfall recorded in the GMA in 2022/23 was above average with 834.2 mm recorded at the Mangalore station 88109, as a result groundwater levels in the Nagambie Zone have responded with an increasing trend which has not occurred since the 1990s. Groundwater levels and rainfall charts are provided overleaf.

Seven licence holders have participated in an annual bore sampling program, since 2016/17. Groundwater samples are collected at the same time each year (where practicable) and analysed for salinity. The data collected is used to monitor any changes in groundwater salinity over time. Samples from two bores where collected and analysed in 2022/23.

Groundwater licence volume and use

The total licence groundwater entitlement volume (licence volume) in the GMA is 12,464.9 megalitres per year (ML/yr) (Table 1). The permissible consumptive volume (PCV) in the GMA is 12,470 ML/yr. No licence volume can be issued in excess of the PCV.




Figure 1. Annual recorded use as a proportion of licence volume in the Mid Goulburn GMA

Recorded use in the GMA in 2022/23 was 1,735.2 ML or 14 per cent of total licence volume (Figure 1).

Licence transfers

Under the Plan, licence holders in the GMA may transfer licence volume on a temporary or permanent basis, within or between management zones, provided zone limits are not exceeded.

No transfers occurred in the GMA during the 2022/23 water year.

Carryover

Under the Plan, licence holders in the GMA may carryover up to 20 per cent of their unused licence volume for use in the subsequent year. The volume that has been carried over for use in 2023/24 is 2,459.28 ML.

Licence compliance


In 2022/23, there were no prosecutions or convictions relating to groundwater in the GMA.
