

Upper Murray Groundwater Management Area

The Upper Murray Groundwater Management Area (GMA) covers the Upper Murray River catchment from Omeo north to Corryong and Tallangatta and includes the Mitta Mitta, Corryong and Murray catchments – *map provided overleaf*.

Groundwater resources in the GMA are managed under a Local Management Plan which was approved by Goulburn-Murray Water (GMW) in 2014 (the Plan).

Groundwater licence volume and use

The total licensed groundwater entitlement volume (licence volume) in the GMA is 3,531.6 megalitres per year (ML/yr). The majority is held within the Indi Zone (Table 1).

The permissible consumptive volume (PCV) for the GMA is 7,674 ML/yr. No licence volume can be issued in excess of the PCV.

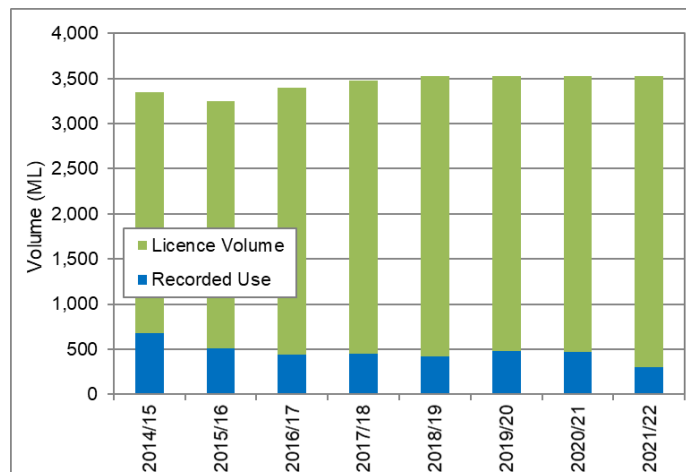


Figure 1. Recorded use as a proportion of licence volume in the Upper Murray GMA

The total recorded use in the GMA in 2020/21 was 296.0 ML, or eight per cent of the total licence volume, which is five per cent less than 2020/21 (Figure 1).

Licence transfers

Under the Plan, licence holders in the GMA may transfer volume on a temporary or permanent basis, within or between management zones, provided zone caps are not exceeded – *refer Table 1*.

No permanent or temporary transfers occurred within the GMA in the 2021/22 season.

Groundwater levels

Groundwater levels are monitored in 10 State observation bores located across the GMA. Groundwater levels in this area are climate driven and therefore fluctuate seasonally.

In 2021/22, groundwater levels have risen in the observation bores at Omeo and Corryong after three years of high rainfall – *refer groundwater-level charts overleaf*.

Licence compliance

In 2021/22, there were no reported instances of alleged unauthorised take of groundwater (including overuse) in the GMA.

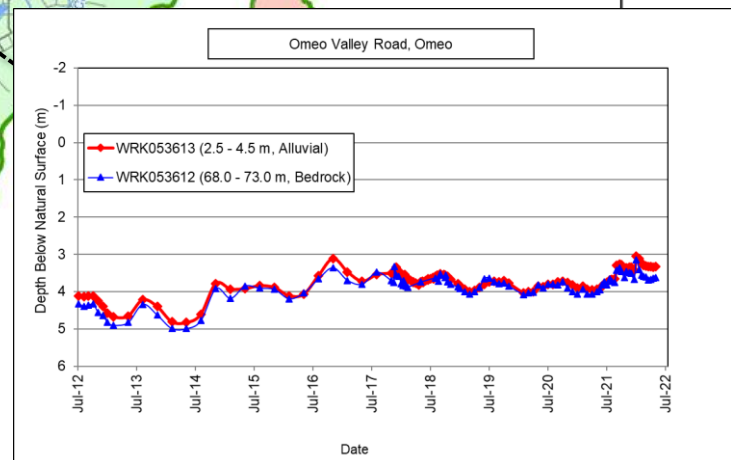
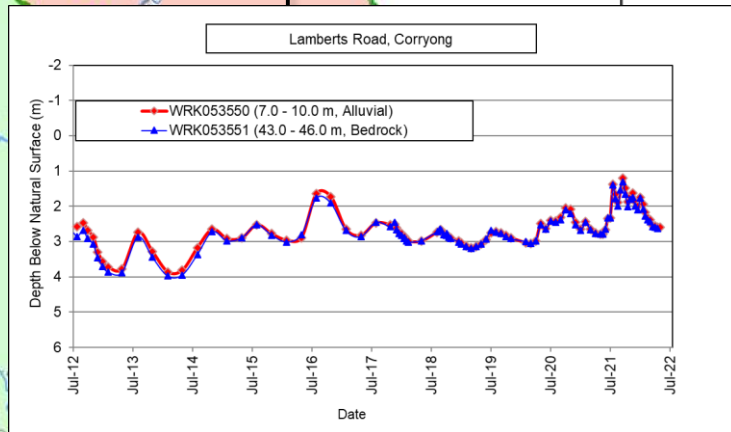
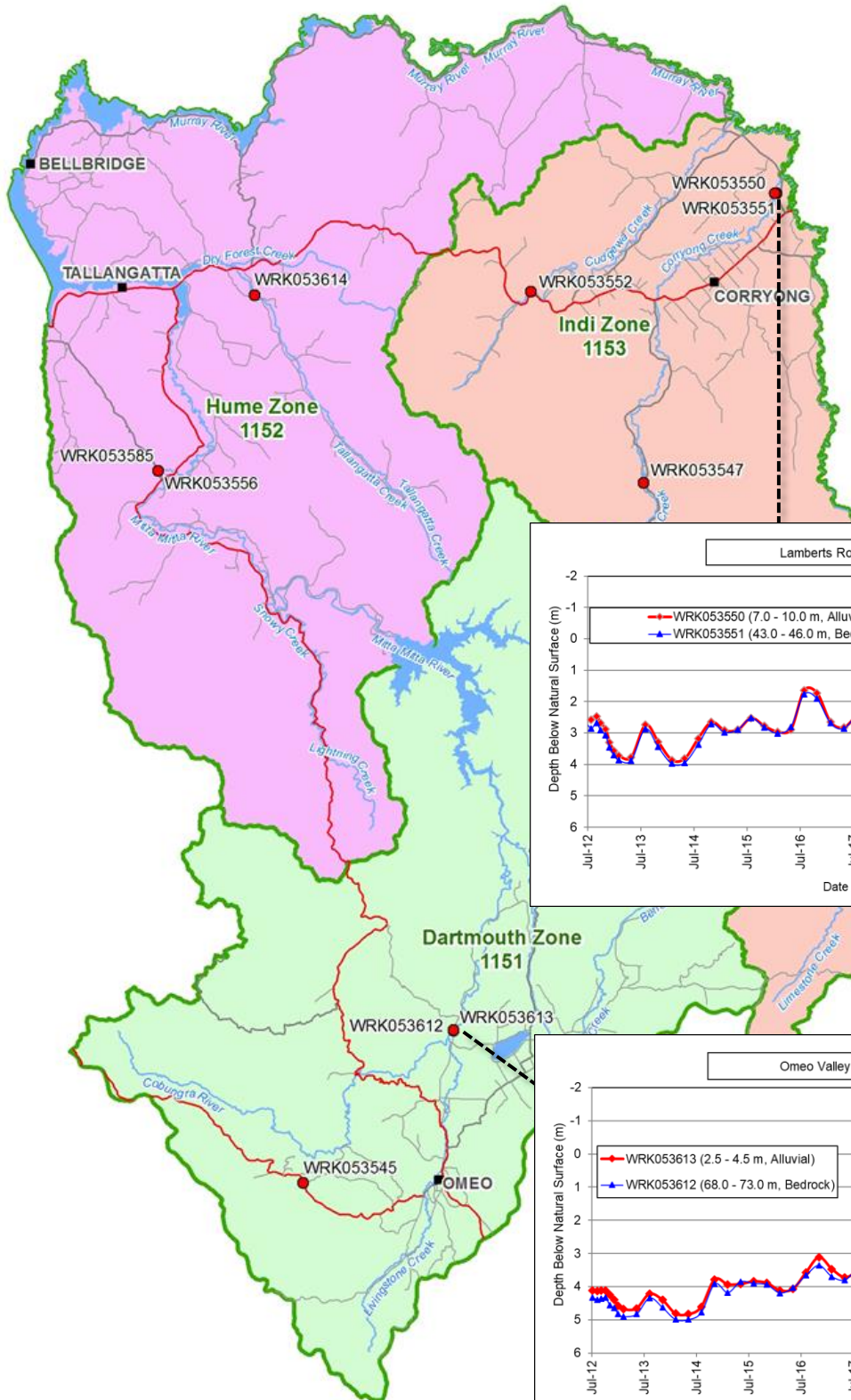
