 Members were updated on the WW2017 program and advised that bank shaping, access tracks and non-critical fencing were still being completed An overview of the "in season" pipelines being constructed by John Holland was provided Reconfiguration planning already in progress and upcoming SCPs (MV has a large number) ECI construction and scope as well as an update on current E2E delivery projects. In Murray Valley 11 are nearing completion and 26 are still to be finalised WSC were advised that all engagement is planned to be completed by June 2018 and their assistance is sought to inform irrigators to attend. Commissioning of new meters now taking priority with irrigation season underway. Resources increased to deal with backlog. Largely a successful winter but has also been quite challenging Some discussion about on-farm issues that had arisen with a customer complaining to WSC chair.
