Return of 75GL, Preferred Return Option – All members	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The committee discussed the preferred option and agreed to the below: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Returned as delivery share allocation, which cannot be permanently traded, however can be traded as allocation on the temporary market, remains within GMID Allocated annually as a separate bulk entitlement, cannot be transferred permanently, the pool within GMID would remain the same and separate to high reliability water The committee did not support the return as water share entitlement as this would not be specific to irrigators and GMW
