Main Topics Discussed

<p>GMW Integrated Enhanced Debt Recovery - Michael Gomez</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Update the committee on the annual financials, with revenue being down due to less than expected water delivery, however GMW are still on track with water Plan. There were also some above forecast spending during the maintenance period mainly around the need to carry out desilting of channels. Discussed debt recovery and the objectives of the program, having Phases 1,2 & 3. In which they will be working through with customers on recovering debt Highlighted there was an opportunity for GMW to contact our customers and encourage those who will be receiving the return of water shares as an opportunity to pay down debt.
<p>Update on Allocation, Reserve Policy & Goulburn to Murray Trade Rule - Mark Bailey</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provided an update on rainfall deciles, totals and forecasts highlighting optimism in the outlook ahead. Key takeaways were the reserve being secure, and catchments being productive. Discussed the Goulburn to Murray trade rule and its Governance.
<p>Customer Charter Update - Greg Shannon</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Consulted with the Committee as they run through the changes in the Customer Charter
<p>Water Efficiency Project (WEP) Brian Letcher on behalf of Peter Egglestone</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The WEP program has kicked off with approximately half of the high priority projects in the customer consultation stage. All of the high priority projects are expected to be underway within the next 2 months. Next winter works is when most of the work will have to be completed hence the urgency for all ground work to be completed prior to May next year.
<p>Channel x Channel Principles - Daniel Irwin, Jeremy Nolan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The presentation to the Committee demonstrated how the data that was collected at the previous water services committee and used to populate the channel x channel matrix. In total there was 47 considerations that were provided during the WSC consultations. The new framework seeks to establish a repeatable process that allows GMW to manage assets based on a range of localised conditions. Discussed bridges & culverts not just being replaced for service standards but also as public safety.

- Updated members on hibernating assets to be identified through service standards.
- GMW's channel system which has been classified into Pods will be carefully assessed to determine the appropriate treatment that ensures that the decisions made are based around the future deliveries in line with farming practices.

Operations Managers report - Brian Letcher

- Provided a general overview of Centrals operations touching on of staff movements, Greens Lake fencing & and the options to an alternative supply connection to the toilet block.
- Updated the Committee on the new office opening hours for all GMW sites being 8:30 to 16:30.
