Indirect expenses, i.e. corporate related costs such as finance and human resources are allocated on varying basis according to their corporate requirements.
	The fees and charges for these services are regulated by the Essential Services Commission (ESC) in accordance with the Water Industry Regulatory Order 2014 (WIRO) issued under the Water Industry Act 1994 .
